### Fast facts about kerbside bin collection services

- Fees for kerbside collection are included in your rates, however additional services such as an extra bin or a return to service will incur costs. Fees and charges can be viewed on Council's website.
- Assisted services are provided to eligible residents with a medical condition or disability. If you need an assisted service, please submit an Assisted Collection Service Form.
- We can't provide a bin collection service if your bin/s can't be accessed safely, is too heavy, is not presented at the time of service, is contaminated with hazardous waste or the wrong items, is not an approved Council bin, or is not in the Council rating assessment.
- If your bin doesn't get collected, we'll leave a sticker on your bin telling you why. Providing the issue is addressed, we'll collect as normal in the following service. We can arrange an additional service, however there is a fee. If your bin doesn't get collected and you don't have a sticker, contact Council and, if there was no mistake on your part, we'll arrange a free missed collection service.
- If your bin was not presented or incorrectly presented (after notice sticker), Council does not return to service unless the customer pays for additional services.
- If your recycling bin is not being used correctly it won't be collected and we'll issue a notification letter. If three letters are issued in a 12 month period, it will be removed.
- **Permanent storage of bins** on the footpath is not allowed and penalties may apply.

### How to find your bins day

Rockhampton Regional Waste and Recycling provides weekly collection of general waste bins (red lid) and fortnightly collection of recycling bins (yellow lid), for properties within declared collection areas.

Check your bin collection day by using our handy 'search your bin day' tool.

## How to place your bins for collection

- Bins will be serviced ANYTIME between 6am and 6pm on your collection day.
- You are permitted to place your bins out • the night before.
- Ensure bins are placed up on the kerb and not down in the gutter, with the lid opening facing towards the street.
- Place bins at least 30cm apart, at least • 1m away from parked vehicles, other obstacles and low hanging branches.
- Ensure bin lid is closed.
- If you live in a cul-de-sac, laneway or commercial area, you may receive a bin placement sticker with specific instructions.

Your yellow lid bin is collected fortnightly, scheduled as either Week 1 or Week 2.


Help your household recyclables get sorted at the Material Recovery Facility by placing them loose and clean into your yellow lid bin.
